



# M.O.S. BIRD RINGING GROUP REPORT FOR 1971

# INTRODUCTION

This special issue carries the third report of the M.O.S. Bird Ringing Group. It is the first time that the Systematic List and the Ringing Report figure in the same number, a format which we hope will be kept in future Ringing Group reports.

1971 was a highly successful year both for ringing and observation. It will long be remembered for the large autumn falls of passerines, record number of birds ringed and a record number of birds recovered abroad.

Seven active ringers (S. Borg, C. Gauci, B.K. German, J. Grech, Br. E. Johnson, J. Sultana and V. Vella Muskat) succeeded in ringing a record total of 7,525 birds of 91 species. These included eight new additions to the ringing list: Ringed Plover, Curlew Sandpiper, Redthroated Pipit, Orphean Warbler, Olivacecus Warbler, Isabelline Wheatear, Thrush Nightingale and Goldfinch. Since ringing was started in Malta many vagrants found their way into our nets. This year was no exception. The high water level at Ghadira receded in May and several waders were present daily. During four ringing sessions over 100 were ringed. In April we had excellent hirundine catches at Ramla Valley and as a result just under 2,000 were ringed. Two expeditions were again organised to Filfla where we ringed a thousand Storm Petrels and a few Cory's Shearwaters. In September and early October a record number of Icterine, Garden, Subalpine, Willow and Wood Warblers was trapped. Between mid-October and mid-November there were continuous falls of Robins and over a thousand were ringed mainly at Buskett and Wied Znuber.

Most of the 13 recoveries of birds reported abroad are very interesting. These include the 2nd Storm Petrel in Tunisia, the 2nd Sand Martin in England, four Swallows in Germany and one in Crete, a Blackcap in Sardinia, a Willow Warbler in Spain, a Chiffchaff in Austria and single Robins in Algeria and Greece.

In the list of foreign ringed birds recovered here we find a few which were recovered in earlier years. These were not previously reported as they only came to our notice last year. The list also includes the first Eleonora's Falcon, Common Sandpiper, Slender-billed Gull and Spotted Flycatcher.

A section of this report is devoted to selected retraps. The first two tables are of special interest as they show the weight gained (in a few cases lost) over

a few days by spring and/or autumn migrants. In spring the longest stay recorded was of a Swallow (8 days). In autumn birds lingered longer (as usual) than in spring and among others we find 2 Subalpine Warblers retrapped after 19 and 14 days respectively, a Redstart after 15 days and a Garden Warbler after 10 days. Another Garden Warbler which was retrapped after 15 days had surprisingly lost nearly 40% of its weight.

Regarding the Systematic List observation by the main contributors was carried out regularly in the following places in Malia: Ghadira, Mtahleb, Buskett, Hal Far, Salina and Chadwick Lakes. In Gozo, Ramla Valley, Lunzjata Valley, Ta' Cenc, Pergla Valley and Ghajnxejba (Xaghra) were the most frequented localities. Usually not more than three localities were visited on any one day and the maximum number of birds recorded on a day (mentioned frequently in the text) should refer to an average of three localities only unless otherwise stated. # SYSTEMATIC LIST

LITTLE GREBE Podiceps ruficollis BLONGUN ZGHIR Singles on 11th October, 7th and 15th November and 10th December.

BLACK-NECKED GREBE Podiceps nigricallis BLONGUN SEKOND 1 on 19th January and 10th February. Early influx in autumn: 1 on 10th, 18th and 30th August, 3 singles on 4th and 4 on 24th September. Then on 5 dates in November and 3 dates in December with 2 on 7th November and 11th December.

GREAT CRESTED GREBE Podiceps cristatus BLONGUN PRIM Unusually scarce. Only one recorded: on 20th December.

CORY'S SHEARWATER Calonectris diomedea CIEFA Breeding as usual but the small colony at Migra Ferha was deserted this year. First noted near the coast on 14th March.

MANX SHEARWATER Puffinus puffinus GARNIJA Bred in usual colonies. Those visited had average success.

STORM PETREL Hydrobates pelagicus KANGU TA' FILFLA As usual bred in large numbers on Filfla.

GANNET Sula bassana SULA 1 off Qbajiar on 31st January; 4 off Ramla on 23rd, 2 off Marsascala on 24th and 2 off Comino on 28th February; 2 off Qbajjar on 6th March. 4 at Delimara and 1 off Sliema on 21st and 1 at Kalafrana on 22nd November.

CORMORANT Phalacrocorax carbo MARGUN
1 at Marsaxlokk on 22nd October and 1 at Kalafrana on 22nd November..

BITTERN Botaurus stellaris KAPPUN Single birds at Wardija on 16th and at Ras il-Pellegrin on 27th March. Singles at Has-Saptan and Kuncizzjoni on 4th and at Buskett on 25th October.

LITTLE BITTERN Ixobrychus minutus RUSSETT TAS-SIGAR Recorded almost daily from 17th April to 17th May. Highest figures were 11 on 4th, 6 on 2nd and 5 on 13th May. In autumn 1 on 29th August, flock of 8 on 4th and singles on 6th and 8th September, then 1-2 on 5 dates in October to 9th.

NIGHT HERON Nyeticorax nyeticorax KWAKKA Flock of 40 on 14th March, then single figures on most days from 16th March to 4th May. Influx on 24th April with 60+ recorded. Late individuals on 21st (4) and 24th May. In autumn recorded almost daily from 23rd August to 5th October, with gaps on 14th-16th, 20th-23rd, 25th-26th and 28th-29th September. Best days were 4th and 8th September with 80+ and 45 respectively, otherwise single or very low double figures. Late birds on 14th (3) and 21st October.

SQUACCO HERON Ardeola ralloides AGRETT ISFAR 1 on 20th, 7 on 21st, 10 on 22nd. 3 or 23rd, 3 on 24th and 1 on 26th April; singles on 3rd. 4th, 5th, 15th and 24th May. In autumn 5 on 18th and 1 on 31st August, 11 on 4th and 1 on 8th September, and 1 on 3rd October.

GREY HERON Ardea cinerea RUSSETT GRIZ 4 on 8th January. Single figures on 12 dates from 13th March to 2nd May. 1 on 22nd June and 20th July. In August, 5 on 9th, 2 on 15th, 50 on 17th, 15 on 18th, 1 on 21st and 6 on 30th. Then almost daily from 2nd September to 5th October, with high double figures on 3 dates and 120 on 2nd October. Singles on 18th and 19th October and on 20th and 26th November.

PURPLE HERON Ardea purpurea RUSSETT AHMAR In March recorded on 1st (2), 14th, 16th (14) and 27th, 1 on 17th then daily from 20th to 24th April, with 13 on 21st highest, 1 on 15th May, Only one good passage in autumn — on 19th September (40+ logged), otherwise one on 19th and 30th August and single or very low double figures on 6 dates in September and 5 dates in October to 15th, 1 on 1st and 2 on 26th November.

WHITE STORK Ciconia ciconia CIKONJA BAJDA A dead oiled bird was washed ashore at Salina on 6th May

OSPREY Pandion haliaetus ARPA Singles on 2nd, 9th and 23rd April, and on 22nd May in spring. In autumn recorded on 4th, 19th, 20th, 23rd, 24th and 28th September and on 2nd, 4th, 8th and 21st October. Singles, except on 19th September — 3 and on 4th October — 2

HONEY BUZZARD Pernis approrus KUĆĆARDA 2 on 28th March then single or very low couble figures on 9 dates from 20th April to 12th May. Flocks of 14 on 27th and 28th and 1 on 29th May. In autumn, occasional singles from 15th August then daily from 8th September to 14th October, with small gaps on 1st. 6th-7th and 11th October. Low double figures on most days in September. Heaviest passages recorded on 4th October — 300+, and on 18th, 19th and 20th September with 60+, 90+ and 50+ respectively.

RED KITE Milvus milvus ASTUN AHMAR 1 at Marsascala on 19th August BLACK KITE Milvus migrans ASTUN ISWED Recorded only in September: 2 on 3rd, 1 on 8th and 10th, 4 on 16th, 1 on 19th. 2 on 20th and 1 on 21st and 24th.

SPARROW HAWK Accipter nisus SPARVIER 1 on 3rd April. In autumn 2 on 48th and 23rd and singles on 21st and 24th September, and on 2nd, 4th, 8th, and 16th October.

BUZZARD Buteo buteo KUĊĊARDA PRIMA 1 on 21st March. 1 on 4th and 26th and 2 on 30th October

BOOTED EAGLE Hieraaetus pennatus AJKLA TAL-KALZETTI 1 at Mgarr on 4th October (4th record for Malta)

LESSER SPOTTED EAGLE Aquila pomerina AJKLA TAT-TTXKI 1 at Buskett on 20th September and 1 at Ta' Qali on 4th October.

SHORT-TOED EAGLE Circaetus gallicus AJKLA BAJDA 1 at St. Andrew's on 15th September and 2 at Buskett on 23rd September.

HEN HARRIER Circus cyaneus BUGHADAM ABJAD PRIM 1 on 8th, 20th, 21st and 27th March. 2 on 2nd and 1 on 14th April.

PALLID HARRIER Circus macrourus BUGHADAM ABJAD 1 on 21st February then on 15th, 17th, 20th, 21st, 22nd and 29th March and on 3rd April; singles except on 22nd — 2. Very late bird on 24th May. Only one in autumn — on 13th October.

MONTAGU'S HARRIER Circus pygargus BUGHADAM GRIŻ 1-2 on 1st, 3rd, 9th, 14th, 14th, 18th, 22nd, 23rd, 24th and 25th April and on 8th May. In autumn singles on 16th, 17th and 27th September and on 2nd and 4th October.

MARSH HARRIER Circus aeruginosus BUGHADAM AHMAR Occasional singles from 27th February then single figures on most days from 16th March to 7th May, but with two notable gaps on 3rd-7th and 10th-17th April. Highest concentration on 21st-24th March with 27 logged. In autumn single figures on 13 dates from 8th September to 10th October with 8 on 2nd October highest.

EGYPTIAN VULTURE Neophron percnopterus AVULTUN ABJAD 5 recorded in September: 1 at Manikata on 14th, 2 at Birzebbugia on 19th, 1 at Buskett on 24th and 1 at Rabat on 26th.

PEREGRINE Falco peregrinus

Pair resident at south western coast of Gozo throughout the year. Another pair along the western coast during July. Singles seen as follows: at Ghadira on 22nd February; at Hal Far on 19th and at Ghadira on 29th March; at Wardija on 27th April; at Wied il-Kbir on 27th June; at Marsalforn on 2nd at Delimara on 7th and at St. Paul's Bay on 8th July and at Harrax (Hill on 21st October.

HOBBY Falco subbuteo SEQER TAL-HANNIEQA Spring passage rather lean with low single figures on 18 dates from 11th April to 15th May. Single birds on 20th May, 5th June, 6th July and 10th August. In autumn after 3 on 3rd, daily from 3th September to 26th October with gaps on 17th-18th September and 5th-8th, 14th-15th, 17th-19th and 22nd-25th October. Single or very low double figures. Best days were 24th September, 3rd and 4th October with 27, 35+ and 30+ respectively.

ELEONORA'S FALCON Falco eleonorae BIES TAR-REGINA Single birds at Wardija on 23rd April, at Rabat on 11th July, at Buskett on 10th August, 9th and 24th September and on 2nd October, and at Mtahleb on 10th October. All dark phase In July a pair was regularly seen along the western coast.

SOOTY FALCON Falco concolor ZUMBRELL GHARBI A male was shot at Marsa on 16th June. (2nd record for Malta.)

MERLIN Falco columbarius SEQER TA' DENBU 1 at St. Andrew's on 2nd April.

RED-FOOTED FALCON Falco vespertinus 2UMBRELL Daily from 18th to 26th April, then less regular (12 dates) till 18th May. 1 on 1st June. Highest 23 on first date, otherwise single figures. In autumn singles on 24th and 26th September and on 2nd, 5th and 14th October.

LESSER KESTREL Falco naumanni SPANJULETT SEKOND Low single figures in spring: 21 dates from 12th March to 24th May. 2 on 30th June. In autumn recorded on 19th-20th and 24th-27th September; 2nd-4th, 9th, 12th-13th and on 20th-21st October. Highest 25+ on last date, otherwise single figures.

KESTREL Falco tinnunculus SPANJULETT Single birds on 5 dates in January and 3 dates in February. Almost daily from 6th March to 29th May; double figures on 19th, 27th and 30th April with 10, 25 and 13 respectively. Singles on 3 dates in June and 4 dates in August. Autumn passage from 8th September to 6th November. Best days were 12th (30), 13th (38) and 21st (160+) September, and 2nd (45), 3rd (90) and 4th (26) October. On 4 dates in November from 15th and on 5 dates in December.

QUAIL Coturnix coturnix SUMMIENA On most days from 28th February to 15th May; mostly single figures, but large influx on 18th April — 250+ recorded. From 9th September to 9th October in autumn with marked influxes on 9th, 20th and 21st September — 150+, 300+ and 50+ respectively.

CRANE Grus grus GRAWWA 1-3 on 9 dates from 30th September to 11th November. Passage on 22nd November with flocks of 24 at Safi, 26 at Kalafrana and 28 at Salina (possibly same flock).

WATER RAIL Rallus aquaticus GALLOZZ TAX-XITWA 1-2 at Lunzjata Valley throughout January and till 5th February. Singles on

7th February, 24th, 27th and 29th March, 14th April and 14th May. Then from 11th October, with singles on 3 dates in October, on 6 in November and on 3 in December.

SFOTTED CRAKE Porzana porzana GALLOZZ TAT-TIKKI 1 at Wied il-Luq on 1st-3rd January and 1 at Salina on 20th February, then 1-2 cn 9 dates from 6th March to 20th April. In autumn 1 on 31st August then on 14 dates from 22nd September to 8.h November. 2 cn 16th October, otherwise singles.

LITTLE CRAKE Porzana parva GALLOZZ ŻGHIR Single birds at Mtahleb on 14th March, at Wied ir-Rum on 1st and at Ramla Valley on 24th April, and at Salina on 3rd October.

BAILLON'S CRAKE Porzana pusilla GALOZZ TAL-FAXXI 1 at Marsascala on 31st March and 1 at Marsa on 4th October.

CORNCRAKE Crex crex GALLOZZ AHMAR 1 at Faqqanija on 21st September and 1 at Zabbar on 19th November.

COOT Fulica atra TIGIEGA TAL-BAHAR 1 on 23rd January and 2 on 13th September. 2 on 6th and 1 on 11th and 13th October. In November, 4 on 3rd, 2 on 5th, 3 on 17th, 1 on 19th and 12 on 28th. 1 on 5th and 21st December. Most records from Salina.

OYSTERCATCHER Haematopus ostralegus GALLINA TAL-BAHAR 2 in the south Cominc Channel on 26th and 2 at Salina on 27th July were probably the same birds. 1 at Bahar ic-Caghaq on 2nd September.

RINGED PLOVER Charadrius hiaticula MONAKELLA PRIMA 1 on 21st and 22nd April, then 1-3 on most days from 2nd May to 5th June. (Most records from Ghadira). In autumn 1 on 31st August at Salina, 3 from 8th to 14th September and 1 on 10th October at Ghadira, and 1-3 from 17th September to 16th October at Hal Far.

LITTLE RINGED PLOVER Charadrius dubius MONAKELLA 1 on 22nd January and 15th February, then single or very low double figures almost daily from 14th March to 22nd May. I on 4th and 26th July, then single figures on most days from 23rd August to 26th October. Double figures on 5 days: 4th (25+), 5th (20+) and 8th (18) September, 1st (13) and 5th (50+) October.

ENTISH PLOVER Charadrius alexandrinus MONAKELLA SAQAJJHA SUWED 2 at Salina on 6th March and singles at Armier and at Salina on 26th July 2 at Marsaxlokk on 8th, 2 at Ghadira on 13th-15th and 2 at Hal Far on 17th September 1 at Ghadira on 6th October.

CASPIAN PLOVER Charadrius asiaticus BIRWINA TAL-ASJA 1 at San Lawrenz, Gozo en 19th May. (4th record for Malta).

DOTTEREL Eudromias morinellus

1 on 22nd March and 3 on 22nd August. 1-5 on scattered dates from 15th
September to 28th November. Heavy passage on 8th November.

GOLDEN PLOVER Pluvialis apricaria PLUVIERA Flock of 70 — 30 at Hal Far throughout January. In other places occasional singles during January and February. 2 on 15th March. 1 on 4th, then single or low double figures from 29th October. Flock of 30 at Hal Far from 19th November.

GREY PLOVER Piuvialis squatarola PLUVIERA PASTARDA 1 at Ghallis on 2nd August.

LAPWING Vanellus vanellus VENEWWA 12 on 24th January, 2 cn 6th and 1 cn 19th February, 1 on 4th and 7th March. Then from 26th October to 1st November with 9 at Hal Far, and again from 19th to 26th November, with 95 cn 22nd and 50 on 24th.

TURNSTONE Arenaria interpres MONAKELLA IMPERJALI Single birds on 21st, 24th and 28th April and on 5th May in spring, and on 8th, 19th, 21st and 25th September and on 20th November in autumn.

TEMMINCK'S STINT Calidris temminckii TERTUXA GRIZA 1-3 at Ghadira from 19th to 23rd April; in May 1-3 on 9 dates from 2nd to 24th, mostly at Ghadira and Ramla Valley. In autumn single birds on 26th July and on 4th and 15th September.

DUNLIN Calidris alpina BEGGAZZINA TAT-TI22 Singles on 23rd, 27th and 31st August then 2-6 daily at Ghadira from 13th September to 12th October. Also 4 on 17th September and 1 on 8th October at Hal Far. I on 23rd October and 27th November.

CURLEW SANDPIPER Calidris ferruginea BECGAZZINA HAMRA After 1 on 27th March, 1-5 on 8 dates from 14th April to 8th May and 3-9 at Ghadira from 13th to 22nd May. 2 on 15th and 1 on 17th September.

KNOT Calidris canutus GIRWIEL TA' SAQAJH QOSRA ! at Ghadira on 20th May. (4th record for Malta).

SANDERLING | Calidris alba | PISPISELLA BAJDA | Singles on 5th, 13th and 16th May, All at Marsascala.

RUFF Philomacus pugnax GIRWIEL Single figures on most days from 22nd March to 21st May. 25 on 12th April. In autumn on scattered dates from 21st August then on most days from 17th September to 8th October. Double figures (highest 22 on 17th September) recorded on 4 dates.

SPOTTED REDSHANK . Tringa erythropus CUVETT 1 on 19th and 26th April; 1 on 1st July; 4 on 25th August; 3 on 17th and 1 on 20th September, and 1 on 6th November.

REDSHANK Tringa totanus PLUVEROTT Recorded on scattered dates from April to November. Singles unless otherwise indicated: on 17th April; 2nd (4) and 4th May; 2nd, 10th and 28th June; 5th and 26th July; 6th, 12th (8), 18th (2), 23rd and 27th August; 1st, 9th, 13th and 18th September; and 27th November.

Scattered migrants from 43th September then daily from late October with up to 40 at Buskett from 3rd December onwards.

WHITETHROAT Sylvia communis BEKKAFIK AHMAR Spring passage from 28th March to 26th May with peak days on 24th and 26th April, 2nd-6th, 15th-16th and 20th May. Best day was 16th May (80 logged) otherwise not more than 45. A male was singing in display flight at Buskett on 6th June. 2 on 10th, 22nd and 26th August. Influx on 4th-8th September with 30 on first date then 1-3 on 9th-14th, 3 on 19th and 1 on 20th. Renewed passage on 1st October with main influx on 3rd (40 recorded) and up to 12 daily till 10th. 1 on 13th and 16th and 2 on 24th October.

LESSER WHITETHROAT Sylvia curruca BEKKAFIK IRMIEDI 1 at Mtahleb on 17th April. 3 singles in October: at Mtahleb on 3rd and at Wied il-Luq on 4th and 31st.

SARDINIAN WARBLER Sylvia melanocephala BUFULA SEWDA Very common breeding resident in usual numbers.

SUBALPINE WARBLER Sylvia cantillans

BUFULA PASSAJRA
Spring passage small and scattered from 21st March to 6th May with several
large gaps. Only one good influx: on 28th March (45 recorded) otherwise low
single figures. 1 on 9th and 23rd then daily from 27th July to 23rd September.
Double figures with maximum of 50 on 12th August and 5th September. Renewed small movement a week later with 1 on 28th September and 6 on 2nd,
10 on 3rd and 1 on 10th October.

SPECTACLED WARBLER Sylvia conspicillata BUFULA HAMRA Present in usual numbers.

DARTFORD WARBLER Sylvia undata BUFULA TAX-XAGHRI Up to 6 throughout January and February to 8th and 2 on 5th March at Ghadira. In other places singles at Hal Far on 24th January; at Ta' zuta on 1st, at Kalafrana on 18th, at Ramla Bay on 21st and at Salina on 25th February; and at Hal Far on 19th March, 1-2 at Hal Far on 19th November and 1 at Ghadira on 28th December.

WILLOW WARBLER Phylloscopus trochilus VJOLIN PASTARD Daily from 21st March to 4th May then slightly less regular till 23rd May. Double figures on 28th March; 2nd, 6th, 10th, 12th, 13th, 18th, 23rd-25th April; 4th and 15th May with 20 on 24th April highest. 1 on 22nd and 1 on 31st July. 1-5 on 13 dates in August then daily from 3rd September to 10th October with stragglers up to 23rd. Double figures on several days in September and early October with 65 on 5th September highest.

CHIFFCHAFF Phylloscopus collybita VJOLIN TAX-XITWA High double figures in several places throughout January and February. Few during 1st-5th March then again up to 80 till 22nd; single figures on most days to 10th April. Few from 2nd October reaching low double figures late in the month. 60 at Lunzjata on 18th December otherwise never more than 30.

BONELLI'S WARBLER Phylloscopus bonelli VJOLIN BAJDANI Small passage in spring: 1 on 24th, 28th and 29th and 2 on 31st March; 1 on 2nd, 3rd and 11th, 2 on 17th and 1 on 25th April; 1 on 2nd and 9th May. Most birds were recorded at Ghadira. 1 at Buskett on 12th August.

WOOD WARBLER Phylloscopus sibilatrix VJOLIN AHDAR Singles on 28th and 31st March then almost daily from 7th April to 25th May. Double figures only for short period of 25th April — 4th May with maximum of 20 on last date. Good autumn passage with several large influxes: 1 on 11th and 16th August then daily from 3rd September to 16th October with gaps on 16-17th, 21st-22nd and 28th-30th September and 11th-15th October. Influxes on 4th-9th and 19th September and 1st-5th October; 105 on 3rd October and fairly high double figures on other influx days.

GOLDCREST Regulus regulus BUFULA TAL-QAMAR Single figures (maximum 6) throughout January, February and March to 24th. Slight increase in March probably due to birds wintering south of Malta. 1 on 16th and 2 on 25th and 28th October then regular from 1st November onwards. Up to 20 (on 15th December) on most days at Buskett.

FIRECREST Regulus ignicapillus BUFULA TAT-TOPPU AHMAR in about same numbers as Goldcrest in January and February but seen in a larger variety of habitats. None during the first half of March then small movement between 17th and 27th with 8 at Buskett on 22nd-23rd highest. 2 on 2nd April. From 3rd October chwards in autumn with double figures on most days after 15th. Peak. 30 at Buskett in late November and early December.

FAN-TAILED WARBLER Cisticola juncidis BAGHAL TAL-IMREWHA 1 at Marsaxlokk on 9th-10th April and 2 at Salina on 9th August.

PIED FLYCATCHER Ficedula hypoleuca ZANZARELL ISWED Singles on 29th-30th March and 1st April then on most days from 7th April to 16th May. Main passage between 23rd and 28th April and 2nd and 5th May, with 50 on 4th May highest. Singles figures on most other days. In autumn daily from 4th to 13th September with 15 on 7th highest. 1 on 27th September then influx on 3rd-5th October with 35 on last date highest. 1 on 7th and 10th and 6 on 31st October.

COLLARED FLYCATCHER Ficedula albicollis ŽANŽARELL TAL-KULLAR Spring passage smaller than usual: single figures on 8 dates between 13th and 28th April with 12 on 19th. Singles on 4th, 15th and 16th May. In autumn 2 on 4th-5th, 13 on 7th, 1 on 8th, 10 on 11th and 1 on 12th September and 3 on 3rd, 4 on 4th and 10 on 5th October. This is only the second time that this flycatcher has been recorded in autumn.

RED-BREASTED FLYCATCHER *Ficedula parva* ZANZARELL TA' SIDRU AHMAR Record autumn with birds present on 8 days: 24th September; 3rd, 9th, 10th, 16th, 20th October; 6th and 18th November. Singles except for 2 on 10th October.

SPOTTED FLYCATCHER Muscicapa striata ZANZARELL TAT-TFKKI 1 on 10th and 12th then almost daily from 19th April to 4th June. Double figures on 24th and 28th April, 3rd-6th and 15th-23rd May, highest 45 on 16th May. Pair with 3 fledged young seen at Buskett on 6th-10th June then 1-5 birds seen on several dates till 18th August. At Wied il-Kbir 1 was seen on 27th June then 4 and 3 together (probably family party) on 30th June and 11th July respectively. Also 1 at Gzira on 17th June, Autumn passage from 27th August and

daily to 24th October. Low single figures except on influx days — September: 4th (10), 5th (30), 6th (15), 7th (60), 8th (25), 11th (10) and 25th (10); October: 2nd (60), 3rd (300), 4th (250), 5th (160) and 20-40 on 6th-10th.

WHINCHAT Saxicola rubetra BUCAQCAQ TAS-SILLA Spring passage from 4th April to 25th May with birds present on most days; double figures on 9th and 12th-16th April, 2nd-6th and 15th May, highest 25 on two days. 1 on 3rd June. Small and scattered autumn passage from 29th August to 24th October with 12-15 on 19th September and 5th-8th October, otherwiss very low single figures on 15 days.

STONECHAT

Saxicola torquata

BUCAQCAQ TAX-XITWA
Up to 15 daily till 24th March. Then from 4th October; high double figures (maximum 60 on 23rd October) on several days between 10th October and 19th
November, then single or very low double figures in most places till year end.

WHEATEAR Oenanthe oenanthe KUDA On most days from 10th March to 16th May. Main days of passage (20-25 recorded) 22nd-27th March, 18th and 22nd-23rd April and 2nd-4th May. Single figures in August from 12th and double figures on most days in September (highest 80 on 7th). Treble figures between 1st and 10th October (highest 300 at Hal Far on 3rd) then decreasing to double figures and gradually singles after 16th and till 24th. 1 on 1st November.

BLACK-EARED WHEATEAR Oenanthe hispanica KUDA DUMNIKANA Low single figures on 20 dates between 21st March and 8th May with 10 on 24th March. Autumn passage smaller with birds recorded on 9 days between 18th August and 30th September. Singles except for 4 on 9th and 2 on 21st September.

DESERT WHEATEAR Occuanthe deserti KUDA TAD-DEZERT 1 was caught at Wied il-Ghajn in January. (4th record for Malta).

ISABELLINE WHEATEAR Oenanthe isabellina KUDA IZABELLINA 1 trapped and ringed at Hal Far on 6th September. (2 record for Malta)

RUFOUS BUSH CHAT Cercotrichas galactotes ROZINJOL TAX-XAGHRI Single birds on 14th, 15th and 23rd April, and on 3rd May.

ROCK-THRUSH

Monticola saxatilis
GANBUBLU
1-3 on 13 dates between 20th March and 4th May. In autumn singles on 4th,
7th and 9th September and on 5th October.

BLUE ROCK THRUSH Monticola solitarius MERILL Resident. Good number of young seen on the wing from late April.

PLACK REDSTART Phoenicurus ochruros KUDIROSS ISWED Up to 10 in suitable habitat during January. In smaller numbers during February and March to 24th. Again from 23rd October onwards with up to 8 till mid-November and then smaller numbers.

REDSTART Phoenicurus phoenicurus KUDIROSS on 14th then on most days from 22nd March to 16th May. Single and occa-

sional very low double figures, highest 14 on 16th April. Late birds on 21st (3), 25th (2) and 29th May. 1 on 20th June. In autumn daily from 3rd September to 25th October. 100 on 3rd October and double figures from 23rd September to 10th October with 40-60 on 4 days. 1 on 3rd November.

ROBIN Erithacus rubecula PITIRROSS Double figures in January and February with up to 80 at Buskett. Smaller numbers in March. 1-2 on most days in April to 20th. 1 on 1st, 3rd and 19th May. 1 at San Anton on 27th July and 1-2 at Buskett from 23rd July and throughout August. 1-3 in several places in September increasing to 20+ at Buskett by the end of the month. Treble figures (maximum 600) in most places in October and early November when several large falls recorded; then smaller numbers but 300 at Buskett till year end.

THRUSH NIGHTINGALE Luscinia luscinia ROŻINJOL PRIM 1 trapped and ringed at Wied il-Luq on 29th September. (4th record for Malta).

NIGHTINALE Luscinia megarhynchos ROŻINJOL Spring passage smaller than usual: single figures from 18th March to 28th April with 18 on 10th and 10 on 11th April. 1 on 1st, 2 on 3rd and 9th, and 1 on 15th-16th May. In autumn 1 on 31st July, 10th and 20th August then daily from 24th August to 10th October with double figures on most days except at extreme ends. Highest 50 on 5th-8th and 60 on 19th September. Singles on 16th, 17th and 19th October.

BLUETHROAT Luscinia svecica KUDIROSS BLU A record spring: singles at Siggiewi on 13th, at Mtahleb on 20th and at Salina on 22nd March. 1-2 were present at Ghadira from 25th March to 17th April (6 were ringed during this period). 3 were at Hal Far on 10th April and singles at St. Andrew's on 23rd April and at Bingemma on 2nd May. Only 1 in autumn: a male at Wied il-Luq on 7th October.

FIEIDFARE

Turdus pilaris

MALVIZZUN TAL-QTAJJA
6 on 9th and 1 on 11th January. 1 on 11th-12th and 3 on 23rd and 27th February.
1 on 16th March. 1-2 on 25th October, 5th-7th, 41th, 12th and 15th November, 4th and 18th December.

RING OUZEL Turdus torquatus MALVIZZ TAS-SIDRA BAJDA Singles on 4th January, 10th October, 12th and 17th November and 26th December.

BLACKBIRD Turdus meruta MALVIZZ ISWED Small numbers (maximum 3) regularly in January, February and March to 21st. Odd birds on 24th April, 7th May and 25th July. 1 on 2nd then regular from 20th October onwards. Double figures (maximum 26) on most days between 24th October and 12th November.

REDWING Turdus iliacus MALVIZZ AHMAR On 9 days in January, 9 in February and 3 in March to 9th. High single figures on most days with 15 on 14th February and 40 on 31st January. On 4 days in November from 5th and on 10 days in December with 8 on 26th November highest. Most records from Buskett.

SONG THRUSH

Turdus philomelos

MALVIZZ

Double figures (maxumum 30 on several days) in January and February. Slightly
smaller numbers in March but unusual very heavy passage on 16th with several
thousands moving north. Stragglers on 7 dates in April to 20th and 1 on 14th
May. 1 on 21st and 22nd and 3 on 30th September then regular from 2nd October onwards. Main southward movement from 19th October to 7th November
with treble figures on 19th-25th and 30th October, maximum 750 on 21st. Only
single or very low double figures after 8th November.

MISTLE THRUSH Turdus viscivorus MALVIZZUN PRIM 1 on 17th and 28th and 3 on 30th October. Singles on 3rd, 5th and 7th November.

CORN BUNTING Emberiza calandra DURRAJSA Breeding in usual numbers. In flocks of up to 30 from late July, 200+ were counted coming in at Mtahleb on 16th August.

ORTOLAN BUNTING Emberiza hortulana ORTOLAN Singles on 19th, 23rd and 24th April and 3 on 9th May. 1 on 4th September.

LITTLE BUNTING Emberiza pusilla DURRAJSA QERQNIJA 1 at Tal-Handaq on 24th October and 1 at Hal Far on 4th November, 1 caught in early December) (4th, 5th and 6th records for Malta).

REED BUNTING Emberiza schoeniclus DURRAJSA TAL-QASAB Singles at Salina on 16th January, 24th February and 5th November 1 at Ghadira on 1st November.

CHAFFINCH Fringilla coelebs SPONSUN Single figures in January, February and March but 19 on 6th, 50 on 7th and 20 on 13th March. 2 on 2nd and 1 on 23rd and 28th April. 2 on 25th and 1 on 29th June. Up to 5 at Buskett from 6th July and throughout August and September. Autumn passage from 25th September; high double or low treble figures on several dates in October and November. Smaller numbers in December. Maximum 160 on 30th October.

BRAMBLING Fringilla montifringilla SPONSUN SELVAGG 2 on 5th and singles on 11th and 13th November, 2 in early December.

SERIN Serinus APPARELL Single or very low double figures in January, February and March to 24th. 1 on 15th and 28th April and on 18th and 28th September. Single figures on 24th-1st October and 2 on 15th November, then low double figures from 3rd December onwards.

GREENFINCH Carduelis chloris VERDUN Low single figures on scattered days during the first three months. 1 on 9th April. On most days from 19th October onwards. Double figures on several days and 200 on 15th November and 350 on 3rd December.

SISKIN Carduelis spinus EKRU In October 3 on 20th, 20 on 24th, 150 on 25th, 5 on 28th, 1 on 29th and 4 on 31st. On 9 days in November to 19th with 7 on 3rd highest. 1 on 5th December.

GOLDFINCH Carduelis carduelis GARDELL 2 on 29th and 1 on 30th January; 2 on 14th and 1 on 15th February; 2 on 7th, 2 on 22nd, 1 on 24th and 25th March; 2 on 14th and 1 on 18th April, 9 on 17th, 1 on 19th, 4 on 30th and 9 on 31st October then on 15 days in November, mostly single figures but 200 on 15th. In December 2 on 5th, 1 on 16th-17, 5 on 18th and 2 on 22nd.

LINNET Acanthis cannabina GOJJIN Single figures in Early part of year then low double figures from late February to 28th April, with larger numbers in mid-March (100 on 23rd highest). Single figures on 4 days in May and 1 on 3rd June, 15th July and 19th August. Up to 10 were present at Ghain Barrani, Gozo throughout the summer. In September flock of 30 on 15th and 3 on 20th. Autumn passage from 9th October with high double or treble figures on most days till Early December. Then smaller numbers till year end. Best days were 20th (400) and 25th-26th (300) October.

TRUMPETER BULLFINCH Rhodopechys githaginea TRUMBETTIER 1 caught at Nadur in January and 2 at Xorb 1-Ghagin on 30th November.

SCARLET ROSEFINCH Carpodacus erythrinus BUMUNQAR Female caught at Buskett on 29th November. (4th record for Malta)

HAWFINCH Coccothraustes coccothraustes GHASFUR TAZ-ZEBBUG 7 in Gozo on 16th March. 1-3 on 20th September, on 5 days in October and 10 days in November. Singles on 3rd, 4th, 6th, 7th and 27th December.

SPANISH SPARROW Passer hispaniolensis GHAMMIEL TAL-BEJT Abundant everywhere all the year round.

TREE SPARROW Passer montanus GHAMMIEL TAS-SIGAR Small numbers present in several localities throughout the year. Present also on Comino. No large passages noted in autumn this year with only a maximum of 10 at Ghadira on 23rd October.

STARLING Sturnus vulgaris STURNELL During January and February seen only in flocks of up to 60 (except for roosting). Smaller numbers in March to 19th. First autumn birds on 20th September with double figures from 28th. Large flocks of up to 2,500 throughout October and early November then smaller numbers with flocks of 1000-2000 only at Hal Far, Safi and Luga.

ROSE-COLOURED STARLING Sturnus roseus STURNELL ROSA One at Ghadira on 5th October.

GOLDEN ORIOLE Oriolus oriolus TAJRA SAFRA Daily from 13th April to 20th May; double figures on 8 days with 35 on 27th April highest. 2 on 23rd and 29th and 1 on 31st May. Singles on 8th, 12th, 25th and 27th August, then daily from 2nd to 28th September (except on 18th) with large influxes on 4th (82) and 5th (80); low double figures on 6th-8th and 11th, otherwise single figures. Another large influx on 3rd October (70) then no subsequent records.

# MALTA ORNITHOLOGICAL SOCIETY

# Principles and Aims:

- (a) The Society's main purpose is to initiate, foster and aid the study of avian fauna in accordance with strictly scientific methods, thereby helping to increase the sum of human knowledge on the subject.
- (b) The Society solemnly affirms its belief in the Conservation of Nature and will pursue whatever actions it deems necessary to ensure adequate protection of wild-life, and to propagate these ideals in the Maltese Islands.

### Membership:

Members can join the Society and participate in all its activities, provided they subscribe to the aims of the Society and further undertake to propagate its views, each in his own sphere of life thus spreading the Society's enlightened ideal and awakening a social conscience that will brook no further deprediation of the living resources of Nature, especially birds.
