Malta Ornithological Society (now BirdLife Malta) founded in 1962 first environmental NGO in Malta aims - the conservation and study of birds and their habitats.

Before 1960 ornithological field studies - virtually inexistent Status, Distribution, Breeding Biology & Colonies of Malta's seabirds - practically unknown.






Create the preconditions for the designation of new marine special protection areas (SPAs) in Croatia in order to address the main problems in conservation of target seabird species.

PROJECT SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES:

Identify marine SPAs at sea in the southern part of Croatia for the Audouin's Gull, the Scopoli's Shearwater and Yelkouan Shearwater.



Eradicate alien terrestrial invasive species (ship rats) that negatively impact on Shearwater breeding colonies and control Yellow-legged Gull population at breeding sites of Audouin's Gulls.
















Main aims of the project





25-nautical mile fishery management zone





The LIFE Arcipelagu Garnija project aims to:



- Ensure the long-term recovery of the species increasing the knowledge of colony sites, number of breeding pairs and and their status, and threats faced
- Reduce the direct and indirect human-caused threats by managing them through informed concrete conservation actions;
- Increase the number of breeding pairs by approximately 10% and the reproductive output of the majority of the breeding colonies by 25%; and
- Tackle the targets of relevant policies, such as Malta's National Strategy and Biodiversity Action Plan (2014-2020), Marine Strategy Framework Directive, Birds Directive and the Integrated Monitoring Programme of the Barcelona Convention.
