





THE MUDSKIPPER

Mudskippers are amphibious fish – they live in and out of water.

HOW CAN THEY BREATHE?

They can absorb oxygen through their skin, their throat and their mouth. They can also retain air bubbles in their gills!

Mudskippers' eyes resemble frogs' eyes! They are large and sit on top of their blunt heads. They can move independently of each other and they can see above and under the water surface at the same time!

HOW DO THEY WALK?

These fish make use of type of movement known as 'crutching'. This name is given because their pectoral fins resemble a pair of crutches.



And, as their name suggests, they are great jumpers! They can jump up to 60 cm in air!

WHERE DO THEY LIVE?
IN THE MANGROVE FOREST!
Mangroves are SURVIVORS!!
They live in conditions that would quickly kill most plants.





Two-banded bream

Young Birders Club



Hi guys!

I am Nick Galea. I'm a birder, a ringer and I have been an active BirdLife Malta member since I was a kid.

I know it can be hard for budding birders to find birds in Malta. So some months ago I set up the Young Birders Club for members aged 8 to 13 so we can share the wonders of birding in Malta. Our club aims to take you to the right place at the right time to see as many birds as possible throughout the year.

Zak Spiteri, one of our most active members, wrote these short reports about what we've been up to in spring. Zak focuses a lot on rare birds but at our outings we look at all of nature.

Hi, I'm Zak Spiteri, I'm 13 and I have been birding since I was eight. Recently

are older. Earlier this year Nick Galea started a club for young birdwatching enthusiasts like me. This spring I joined them on three birdwatching meetups.



Grey heron



Għadira March 2022

We had this meetup at Għadira nature reserve on a really stormy Sunday. As soon as we entered, we saw the massive cloud of **barn swallows** and **house martins** feeding above the water. Later a large flock of **spotted redshanks** landed on an island to feed. We saw other waders, like **ruffs**, **little ringed plovers** and a **greenshank**. A real highlight showed up while we were watching Nick ringing a **red-rumped swallow** – a **woodpigeon** dashed across. Unfortunately none of us got good views but still we all saw this rare bird. Then someone saw a strange bird flying with the swallows and martins. It was a **crag martin**, another rarity. This time we all got good views.

Majjistral March 2022

The second meetup was at Majjistral park. As soon as we arrived, we saw some **tawny pipits** and **Isabelline wheatears**. As we walked on we saw **northern wheatears**, **spectacled warblers**, **hoopoes** and even a **wryneck**, but the highlight was something much rarer. At first we thought it was a black-eared wheatear, but Nick noticed something different about it. We crept closer until we realised it was a **desert wheatear**! This bird's natural range is the deserts of North Africa and the Middle East but this one made its way to Malta!



Kemmuna April 2022

We got off to an exciting start with a **rufous-tailed scrub-robin** hopping around in some bushes, it was far off and didn't allow amazing views but we still saw it. At BirdLife's ringing station some exciting species were being ringed, like **hoopoe**, **scops owl**, **Moltoni's warbler** and several **nightjars**. We also saw a large flock of **bee-eaters** and a **short-eared owl** flying high overhead. We then walked around the island, searching for birds. We were surrounded by **chukars**, **woodchat shrikes** and **turtle doves** but the best was a very rare and shy **Eastern olivaceous warbler**.

Back at the ringing station we had a short break, then went down to the bay for the boat back to Malta. But it didn't end there. Myles McClean, Ray Galea, myself and some others went to L-Ahrax, as earlier some other

birders had spotted a very rare **hoopoe lark**. There were many people and we thought it had been scared off but Myles spotted it walking a few metres away from us! We got very good views of this rarity and it did not seem scared of us at all.

I'm really looking forward to this autumn migration for more meetups and more rare birds. If you're interested in birdwatching do join our club. I guarantee you'll see birds you have never seen before and learn all about them.

The Migration Story


What?

It's not only birds that migrate, is it?

Quite right! Many other animals make amazing journeys every year.

Some walk, some run . . .

We have all watched wildlife documentaries about the great migration of two million wildebeest and zebra across the Serengeti, braving crocodile-infested rivers in their search for fresh grassland. In Canada too, large herds of caribou make even longer journeys across the tundra, and saiga antelope do the same in Central Asia.

. . . others swim!

Several species of fish migrate, like tuna, swordfish, various sharks and of course dorado. Eels and salmon too migrate, but in an opposite direction: eels migrate from rivers down to the sea, and salmon migrate from the sea up the rivers to lay their eggs!

Giants migrate . . .

Whales and dolphins too migrate between regions of the sea, looking for food and nice conditions. Fin whales are the second biggest animals on earth. They are

present in the Mediterranean Sea, and some of them pass close to Malta on their way from the north to the south areas of the Mediterranean.



. . . and tiny ones migrate!

What's really incredible is that even very small animals (like insects) migrate. Several species of butterflies, moths, grasshoppers and dragonflies make impressive journeys, even across wide seas. They all try to get away from nasty weather and to find food.

And bats too!

Some bat species too migrate when the seasons change and their food begins to disappear. Some ¹insectivorous bats that live in Malta hibernate in winter, others fly away to warmer places.

Woodlands

Mediterranean woodlands are typically characterised by evergreen trees with small shrubs covering the undergrowth.

This is the highest type of vegetation that can develop in a Mediterranean climate, it typically develops from maquis, in the absence of disturbance caused by man.

In Malta, this habitat was virtually exterminated, following colonisation by man and through the grazing effects of introduced sheep and goats.

Nowadays, only a few remnants remain, small copses of the Holm Oak (Il-balluta) and the Aleppo Pine (Iż-żnuber) may be found at Il-Ballut tal-Wardija, Il-Ballut tal-Imgiebah, Ta' Baldu/Wied Hażrun, and Il-Bosk in Buskett. Some of the Holm Oaks are estimated to be 500 to 900 years old.

A prime example of this habitat is Il-Buskett, which is located on the south west coast of Malta. It is a semi-natural woodland where trees, namely the Aleppo Pine, together with the Holm Oak, the Olive tree, and the Carob tree (Il-ħarruba) regenerate naturally.

This area is also important for many wood-associated species, including invertebrates, fungi, and birds.

Il-wiżgħa tal-kampanja hija 1indigena f'pajjiżna, imma mhix 2endemika għax mifruxa ma' diversi pajjiżi oħra tal-Mediterran.

Tikber sa xi 15cm. Ġisimha robust b'ringieli 3skwami ppuntati li jagħtu dehra ta' ġilda ħarxa. Tvarja ħafna fil-lewn, minn safranija čara sa kennella skura kważi sewda.

Il-wiżgħa toħroġ tikkacċja billejl. Taqbad baħrijet u insetti oħra. Spiss tħuf ħitan ħdejn lampi tat-triq, għax id-dawl jiġbed l-inseSSI. Ghajnejha kbar ħalli tara fid-dlam.

Biex tagħru biċ-ċert il-wiżgħa tal-kampanja mill-wiżgħa tad-djar iċċekkjawhom subghajhom! Il-wiżgħa tad-djar ikollha dwiefer fuq is-swaba' kolha, il-wiżgħa tal-kampanja jkollha dwiefer fuq it-tielet u r-raba' swaba' biss!



Bhal ħafna rettili, fix-xhur kesħin il-wiżgħa tal-kampanja tagħmel ħinijiet twal rieqda moħbijsa.

Bħall-wiżgħa tad-djar, il-wiżgħa tal-kampanja kapaċi titla' mal-ħitan u tħiġi mas-soqfa bla ma taqa'. Dan tagħmlu mhux bis-suckers imma b'suf fin ma' subghajha li jidher jaġi l-iċċen tumbata f'wiċċi il-ħajt jew saqaf.

Binhar torqod fi xquq qalb il-ġebel jew taħt il-qoxra tas-sigar. Spiss però toħroġ binhar u tongħos fuq xi zokk jew blata sħuna.

Il-ħitan tas-sejjieħ ambjent tajjeb għall-wiżgħa biex tistaħba, torqod u anke tbid.


